COVID-19 Vaccination

A safe, effective COVID-19 vaccine is a critical component of the strategy to reduce illnesses, hospitalizations and deaths associated with the pandemic. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) are developing a phased approach for the dispensing of a new COVID-19 vaccine.


Napa County Public Health's roles and responsibilities for COVID-19 vaccination is planning and preparing healthcare and community partners for vaccine allocation, storage, distribution, & administration in accordance to CDPH guidance; promoting equitable distribution across local communities; and conducting ongoing data reporting and monitoring.

At this time, Napa County Public Health is unable to accept volunteers or early requests for COVID-19 vaccination for those individuals in group that are not prioritized for Phase 1a of vaccination. Napa County is allocating vaccine in compliance with the state's vaccine allocation framework.


COVID-19 Vaccination

Festive Quarantine New Year's Eve Ideas to Ring in 2021


